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Pursuant to Section III.B.11. of the Permanent Injunction entered January 5, 2022 (ECF No. 112), the receiver files this 120-day status report for the period of April 14, 2023 through August 11, 2023.

I.

INTRODUCTION

On August 20, 2021, this Court entered a Temporary Restraining Order ("TRO," ECF No. 19) and appointed Thomas W. McNamara as temporary receiver ("Receiver") for Receivership Entities Internet Transaction Services, Inc. and Intertrans.com, Inc. (collectively, "Intertrans"). Pursuant to the provisions of the Preliminary Injunction (ECF No. 34) entered on September 2, 2021, the Receiver's appointment was confirmed. On January 5, 2022, the Court entered its Final Order of Permanent Injunction (ECF No. 112) which extended the receivership to include the Shell Entity Defendants as Receivership Entities (as those terms are defined in that Order).

II.

RECEIVERSHIP ACTIVITIES

There has been relatively little receivership activity during this most recent period as the vast majority of this receivership's work has been completed. On April 12, 2023, the Department of Justice ("DOJ") filed a forfeiture action to seize the bulk of the Receivership Estate funds. On April 26, 2023, the Court issued a Warrant for Arrest In Rem (ECF No. 11 in related case no. 2:23-cv-02732-JFW-KSx) in the amount of \$4,747,500.00 and the Receiver subsequently transferred these funds to the U.S. Marshals Service. The Receiver intended to thereafter file a final report and request for discharge, but we learned from DOJ that receivership documents will need to be made available to the defendants in the related criminal action. We therefore delayed a request for discharge so these discovery issues can be resolved and receivership materials provided as necessary in the criminal action. Once the issues are determined, the Receiver expects the DOJ to file a second

forfeiture action for the remaining funds in the Receivership Estate and the 1 Receiver will then be in a position to file his final report and request discharge. 2 As to the efforts to collect on the Judgment entered against Theodore 3 Sapperstein and his companies, Hayes Consulting LLC, and Hayes Markets LLC 4 (ECF No. 154), the collection law firm, KMA Law Office of Severna Park, 5 Maryland has been retained to make collection efforts in return for a 30% 6 contingency fee. Relevant information and documentation have been compiled and 7 provided to the collection firm. The firm's collection efforts are ongoing. 8 9 III. RECEIVERSHIP ACCOUNTING 10 Attached as Exhibit 1 is a Receipts and Disbursements Summary for the 11 period April 14, 2023 through August 11, 2023. 12 Receipts during this period were \$10,826.06, primarily consisting of accrued 13 interest on the receivership accounts (\$8,212.18). Disbursements were 14 15 \$4,990,892.75, which, other than the seized funds discussed above, was primarily comprised of payment of the Receiver's Third Interim Fee Application (\$85,558.29 16 Receiver's fees and expenses; \$153,696.96 McNamara Smith legal fees and 17 expenses; and \$1,255.00 Hadron Computer Forensics & Investigations).
